## Cyber Defense Labs and CybExer Enter Strategic Partnership to Support Japan's Cyber Resilience



CDLabs, which became independent from Soliton Systems in 2024, has worked closely with university cybersecurity experts on joint initiatives to strengthen cyber capabilities and foster cyber human resources.
